In our school, we will abide by federal and state laws to provide our students with the best education possible. To this end:

1. We are committed to academic excellence and eliminating the politicization of education. The latest Nation's Report Card demonstrates the dire need to focus particularly on students' proficiency in core subjects like mathematics and reading. We will ensure that instructional time is spent on these subjects, and not on ideology or any political material.
2. We are committed to transparency. We will abide by the [Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment \(PPRA\)](#). We believe that parents are responsible for the upbringing of their children and are the best arbiters of what their children need. We will not attempt to encourage or coerce a child to withhold information from their parents and will be fully transparent with parents regarding all issues pertaining to their child's well-being.
3. We will abide by [federal obscenity law](#), in addition to plain old common sense, in deciding the school curricula and library materials.
4. We will only display national and state flags on school grounds.
5. We acknowledge biological reality. Any policies associated with sports participation, bathroom and locker room use, and accommodations for overnight trips will be based on biological sex (male/female), not preferred gender identity.
6. We will ensure all students, regardless of their background or identity group, know the unique history of the United States. We will ensure that students understand the full story of our nation and the principles of America's founding.
7. We will not perform medical diagnoses on students, including social and mental health interventions, without parental consent.
8. We will require parental consent for participation in all extracurricular activities, including sports and clubs.
9. We acknowledge the importance of the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and will not force our students to violate their religious beliefs in thought, word, or deed, nor will we compel students' speech with mandated language.
10. We are committed to equality and pledge to put in place merit-based policies.
